


Demographics (Million population)












Hogra/Hagra: Symptoms of a social disease






Human development index




Inequality-adjusted human development index



Uneven economic development index




Gender inequality index (2008)






Sharp and/or severe economic decline index






Military expenditure in % GDP (2008)



Military expenditure in Algeria




Security apparatus as a "State within a State" index












Corruption perceptions index




State fragility index (2009)




Human flight

Revolutions in Progress

Challenges

Expected Revolutions

- Conditions of revolution are everywhere
- "Spring window" may be too narrow
- No effect of surprise
- Activation of sectarianism (ethnic, tribal, religious, ideological)
- Overcoming ego (individual and collective)
- Nature and structure of armed forces
- Respect of non violent resistance
- Dealing with external involvement
